COREY BEARAK NEW QUEENS CIVIC CONGRESS PRESIDENT; INSTALLED BY ASSEMBLY MEMBER BARBARA CLARK; ASSEMBLY MEMBER CATHERINE NOLAN KEYNOTES; SENATOR PADAVAN & ASSEMBLYMAN LANCMAN LAUD QCC LEADERS; COUNCILMAN WEPRIN RECOGNIZES OUTGOING PRESIDENT SEAN WALSH

Corey B. Bearak of Bellerose took office as President of the Queens Civic Congress [QCC] following his installation by Assembly Member, Barbara Clark, Monday, October 15, at the Kew Gardens Community Center. Assembly Education Committee Chair Catherine Nolan delivered the keynote address and took questions at the meeting of the Borough-wide coalition of more than 100 civic and other community organizations throughout the borough whose membership represents almost every community in Queens. The program also featured remarks by State Senator Frank Padavan, Assemblyman Rory Lancman and City Council Member David Weprin. The legislators praised (outgoing) QCC President Sean M. Walsh who served as President through the first full decade of the Queens Civic Congress and remains on its board. Each also applauded Bearak's community advocacy and work in city government. Padavan, Clark and Weprin represent Bearak in their respective legislative bodies. Lancman noted he works closely on legislative and community issues with Bearak. Jenifer Manley, Queens Director of the Community Assistance Unit represented Mayor Michael Bloomberg and District Director Lydon Sleeper represented Member of Congress Anthony Weiner. Community Board 9 Chair Andrea Crawford also attended.

In addition to Mr Bearak (North Bellerose Civic Association), Assembly Member Clark also installed Executive Vice President Patricia Dolan (Kew Gardens Hills Civic Association), Treasurer James Trent (Creedmoor Civic Association, Secretary Seymour Schwartz (Briarwood Civic Association) and Vice Presidents Rich Hellenbrecht (Bellerose-Commonwealth Civic Association), Edwin Westley (Jackson Heights Beautification Group), Paul Kerzner (Ridgewood Property Owners and Civic Association), Nagassar Ramgarib (Queens Village Civic Association), David Kulick (Flushing on the Hill Taxpayers Association), Audrey Lucas (Southeast Queens Concerned Neighbors), Tyler Cassell (North Flushing Civic Association), Dorothy Woo (Holly Civic Association), Harbachan Singh (Holliswood Civic Association), Barbara Larkin (Belle Harbor Property Owners Association) and Kathy Masi (Glendale Civic Association of Queens). According to QCC's By-Laws, Mr. Walsh remains on the QCC executive committee as President Emeritus with Founders Robert Harris and Albert Greenblatt.

The meeting also featured reports by Mr. Walsh on the new Yards Zoning Text, Ms. Dolan on QCC's call for withdrawal of legislation to allow advertising on construction sheds and Mr. Kerzner on the City's plans to plans thousands of new trees.

Formed in 1997 through the merger of the United Civic Council of Queens and the Eastern Queens Civic Council, the Queens Civic Congress maintain its updated <u>website</u> (Queens Civic Congress.org) as a portal for community groups. QCC formally release its new platform, <u>CIVIC 2030</u> -- including a resounding rejection of congestion pricing -- and its 2007-2008 <u>meeting</u> schedule including a landmarking and preservation workshop, at its September 17 meeting.
